#### Minister's Message: Churches and Colonialism

It starts with a history lesson: Remember that Canada started as, "New France." That likewise, the United States began as colonies - this time, of England. And that in New Testament times, the dominant Empire started its Roman colonies to spread *their* civilization. Like other colonists, those Romans crucified innocent locals who got in their way - Jesus was just one of thousands of victims to meet such a fate.

Colonial powers have done a great deal of damage throughout history.

In recent years as Canadians we've all been working towards "Reconciliation" - increasingly aware of the dangers of colonialism and the often terrible impacts that settlers had on the indigenous people of Canada. Regretfully, churches had a destructive role in that sad history. Nonetheless, churches are still intended to be a kind of colony - but not a colony of dominance or violence or exploitation - but a colony of God's Kingdom of love and peace.

Churches are called to be an example of caring community - a counter-culture in a world otherwise distracted with pride, and isolated by selfishness. We try to model joyful service, humility, healing and fulfillment.

Jesus still calls his people to bring light and flavour to this beloved world - in ways that learn from the past, and prepare for the future. At Trinity we are always trying to prayerfully discern how to best be one of God's "outposts" for this time, and this place. Do you feel God's tug on your heart to be a part of that?

#### ... from the Roofing Team

The people working on the roofing team are Brenda Holbein, Dave McKenney, Gerry Foster, Jim Dickson, Jim Evans, John Haflidson, Kirk Elliott, Michelina Beam, Ryan Rozicki, Rev. Ted Harrison, and myself.

After months of analyzing and planning, we're really close to starting the actual repairs. The engineer is close to finalizing his drawings and we have a contractor lined up to get the permits for us and to start work as soon as possible. We've estimated that the work will cost \$200,000 and we made our first request for special donations on Sunday, July 21. Several people have already made donations and others have offered to loan us money, so it is certainly looking very promising. At a Board meeting on Tuesday, July 23 we passed several motions giving the roof team everything they need to get the work done.

The scope of the project includes: replacing the rotten beam; replacing the complete roof system including ceiling joists, rafters, decking, and shingles/membrane in at least the 1st "bay" and perhaps the whole McIntyre Street side; removing the failed eaves-troughs on the McIntyre Street side; repairing the checked column; adding connectors to the high timber-frame; fixing the leak on the Main Street side; and repairing the ceiling.

You've all been very supportive and encouraging of the roof team's efforts, and I'm hopeful that you'll be as supportive with your donations. We need early donations to allow us to do the required repair work without borrowing too much, but we expect to have more fundraising in the fall to repay some loans.

## ... from the Finance Committee



For the first six months of 2019, our income of approximately \$188,000 exceeded expenses by about \$3,400. Total offerings, which account for 68% of YTD income, show an increase of 4% over last year's amount for the same period. Thank you for your contributions to our offerings. Thanks also to those folks who have joined the PAR program or increased their PAR contributions.

Kudos to various Trinity Groups, including UCW, AOTS, Trinity Families, Scouts, Choir, Joy Band, Joyful Bells and IV Trinity, for their important contributions to income during the first half of the year. The June YTD income total from these groups is 37% higher than last year. Kudos also to the folks involved in various fund-raising activities during the first half of 2019, including Soup Tasting, Glitter Dinner, Mustard Seed Productions, the Roof Fund and Swiss Chalet. Please recall that Swiss Chalet will give us 10% of your dining room purchases, which is a very generous offer. Save your table receipts and deposit them in designated containers at the church.

Year-to-date expenses of about \$184,000 were 1% lower than last year and include costs of about \$4,500 for initial engineering related to the Roof Project. We anticipate costs for this project to increase over the next few months as additional engineering and investigation work proceeds, leading to a repair plan, budget and construction. Several Finance Committee members are participating in Roof Committee activities, assisting to obtain the significant funds required for the repair work. Probable sources of funding include some money from investment accounts, a loan from United Church of Canada and further fund raising by Trinity folks. We welcome any contribution you can make to the Roof Fund established to help finance this essential project.
